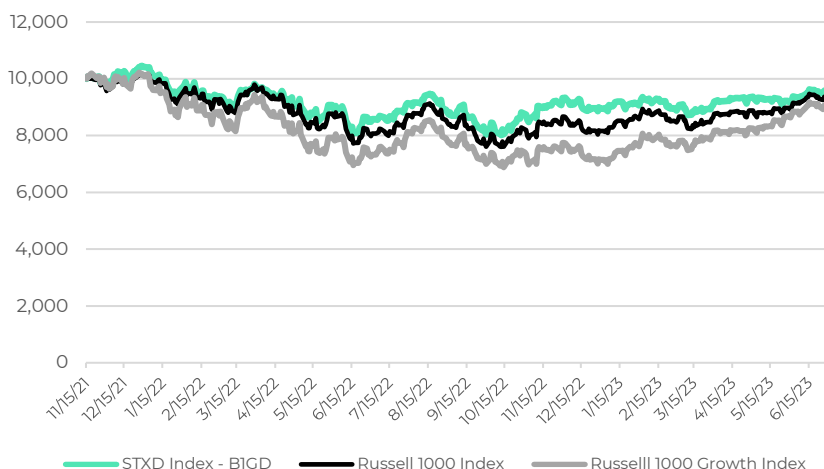
STXD is a passively managed Exchange Traded Fund (ETF) that seeks exposure to U.S. equities with a history of consistently growing dividends.
